I.THE COLLEGE

Govt. Aizawl West College, initially a private College, was established on May 2,1990 at Dawrbui Vengthar in the western part of Aizawl city, the state capital of Mizoram to meet the growing demand of youths for Higher Education, especially for rural and western youths of Mizoram. It was upgraded to Deficit Status on October 01,1995 and thereafter taken over by the Government of Mizoram on October 11, 2007.

The College was first affiliated to NEHU on March 09, 1992 and later to the Mizoram University on July 02, 2001. It was recognized by the UGC on June 23, 2006 under Section 2f and 12B of UGC Act,1956. The College was assessed and accredited by NAAC, Bangalore on May 04,2004 with Grade C+ and reaccredited on January 08,2011 with Grade C.

III. RULES AND REGULATIONS:

i) Application :

After admission notification, intending candidates should apply in prescribed form available from the college office on payment of Rs.10/- within notified period with the following documents:

- b) Two Copies of recent passport size photograph
- c) Testimonial and Transfer Certificate from the last institution.

ii) Eligibility for Admission:

Pass in the Higher Secondary Examination or its equivalent examinations conducted by any recognized Board of the State or Central government.

Candidates passing with vocational courses, the equivalence may be decided by the College Principal.

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VII. FACILITIES PROVIDED

1. Library : The college runs Library at the Ground Floor of Building Complex whereby computerized reading materials, internet facility are available. UGC Net Work Resource Centre is also attached.

2. IGNOU Study Centre: The college hosts IGNOU STUDY CENTRE which Offers a variety of Programmes – Certificate Course, Diplomas, Bachelor Degrees and Master Degrees. Dr R Lalzawnga is the Co-ordinator.

3. Canteen : The College Canteen is run by Staff Welfare Committee to offer different items of Refreshment at reasonable prices.

4. Students' Union : Students Union is formed every year by elected representatives of the students under the chairmanship of the Principal. S. U. looks after the interest and welfare of the students.

5. Remedial Coaching Centre: Subject to availability of fund, Remedial Classes are provided outside the regular Routine to improve academic skills and linguistic proficiency of the Students in various subjects

6. Coaching Classes for entry into Services: For SC/ST and other minority Communities, Coaching Classes are organized, subject to availability of fund, to orient them for examinations conducted by UPSC and other Public Service Commissions.

7.UGC Sponsored Career Oriented Course:

In collaboration with AH & Vety Department, Poultry Farming has been conducted for the students of GAWC. Dr P L Ramliana is the Co-ordinator.

8. Other Co-Curricular Activities: The College undertakes the following Co-curricular activities for the students to achieve qualitative education and Develop leadership quality:

a)National Service Scheme (NSS): Under the supervision and guidance Of Programme Officers, student Volunteers are rendering voluntary Services to the Public- Blood Donation Camp, Integration Camp, Creating Public assets etc.

b) Students' Evangelical Union : Students look after the Union to nurture Spiritual needs among themselves.

c) Students' Self Support Union : It is run by the students to advocate the value of self –supporting during their study.

VIII. REGULATIONS ON SEMESTER SYSTEM OF THREE YEAR

DEGREE COURSE

1.

- a) The under graduate courses shall consist of three academic years with two semesters in each year. Each year shall be divided into two semesters. The First academic year shall comprise of the first and second semesters, the second academic year- the third semester and fourth and the third academic year- the fifth and sixth semesters.
- b) Each semester shall carry 400 marks and the total marks for the entire course shall be 2400.
- c) While taking admission, student will opt for one core subject and two elective subjects. However, on completion of IVth Semester the student may be allowed to change his/her core subject from elective subjects he/she has chosen.
- d) The paper carrying 100 marks without any practical shall comprise of 75 marks for end semester examination and 25 marks for continuous Assessment. Paper having practical will carry 100 marks out of which 70 marks allotted for theory and 30 marks for

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practical. The theory marks 70 will comprise of 55 marks for end semester examination and 15 marks for continuous assessment.

- e) Three class tests, out of which one may be seminar or home assignment, will be conducted in each theory and practical papers Separately for continuous assessment. The average of the best two shall be considered as the marks obtained in the continuous assessment in that paper out of 20 marks. The rest 5 Marks may be allocated to the attendance and class room performance of each student.
- f) Duration of each theory class shall be one hour whereas for practicals It shall be 2 hours.
- g) The syllabus of each paper shall be divided into five units. Total contact hours for each course paper shall be 50.
- h) The odd semesters(1,3 & 5) shall commence from 1st July and the even semesters (2,4 & 6) shall be from 22nd January each academic year.
- i) Semester examination shall be conducted twice- Novem 10 - December 6 for odd semesters and May 14- June 6 for even semesters

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- j) The working days for each semester shall not be less than 90 excluding holidays/Sports/exams/semester break/vacation ,if any.
- k) No candidate shall be allowed to appear in any course more than three times (Including the regular chance), and no candidate shall be allowed to appear in any course beyond ten semesters of his/her first admission.
- l) A candidate shall register his /her name with the University in the first semester itself.
- m) A candidate shall be permitted to proceed from the first semester up to Final semester irrespective of his/her failure in any of the semester examination subject to the condition that the candidate shall appear for all the arrear papers of each course(s) along with the concerned semester examinations.
- n) A candidate shall be eligible to appear in the end semester examination only if he/she attends a minimum of 75 % of class attendance as per the University Ordinance.
- o) Only those First semester students who have filled up the relevant

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Examination forms would be eligible to proceed to the next semester.

2. CONDUCT OF EXAMINATION

- i) University shall conduct all End –Semester Examinations.
- ii) All practical examinations will be conducted by the concerned college. The concerned colleges will retain 75% of the practical Examination fee and the rest 25% will be remitted to the University.
- iii) Each college shall have a Moderation Board/Committee to moderate the marks awarded to a candidate through continuous Internal Assessment and Practical Examinations. The marks awarded in each semester (Continuous Internal Assessment and Practical Examinations) shall be forwarded to the COE, within one month of the completion of each end semester examination.
- iv) The Question paper will contain very short(Multiple choice),Short answer and Descriptive. The distribution of marks will be as follows:

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a) For Full Marks

Section A (Multiple Choice) 10 Questions-10X1 marks=10 marks.
(Two Questions from each unit)

Section B (Very Short) 5 Questions-5x3 marks= 15 marks
(One Question from each unit)

Section C (Descriptive) 5 out of 10- 5x10 marks= 50 marks
(One out of two Questions from each unit)

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b) For Full Marks 55

Section A(Multiple Choice) 5Questions-5x1 marks=5marks
(One Question from each unit)

Section B(Very Short) 5Questions-5x3 marks=15marks
(One Question from each unit)

Section C (Descriptive) 5 out of 10-5x7marks=35 marks
(One out of two Questions from each unit)

TOTAL = 55 marks

3. CLASSIFICATION OF SUCCESSFUL CANDIDATES

- i) A candidate must secure a minimum of 40% of marks(theory and practical where the need arises) in each paper.
- ii) The marks obtained by a candidate in all six semesters shall be taken into account while declaring the results.
- iii) Grades shall be awarded on the basis of marks obtained in each semester.
- iv) iv)Cumulative grade shall be awarded on the basis of grade obtained in all the semesters.

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4. RANKING

Subject-wise ranking shall be awarded. Top 10 candidates who pass all the Examinations prescribed for each subject in the First Appearance alone in the final Result are eligible for ranking / Distinction as per existing Ordinance. Gold Medal Shall be awarded subject-wise only to those candidates who secure over-all first class Position.
